



Ar. Amina Qayyum Mirza

Ar. Amina Qayyum Mirza is the Principal Architect / Partner at AE design firm M/s. Office of Metropolitan Design-OMD, Lahore, Pakistan. Ar. Mirza completed her post-graduation from the University of Pennsylvania, USA with a Master of Architecture-Advance Graduate Program-Second Professional Degree, and received her Bachelor of Architecture with Distinction in First Professional Degree from the National College of Arts, Lahore, Pakistan.

Ar. Mirza has extensive experience as the lead architect for various projects of design, research, and assessment. She has across-the-board knowledge in the design, development, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of projects in a wide range of fields, including Architecture, Interior, Landscape, Urban Design, and Planning.

Ar. Mirza has won a number of design competitions organized by the Pakistan Council of Architects and Town Planners (PCATP). She won national design competition projects for 'Urban Renewal' and 'Restoration of a Heritage Building' under the Planning & Development Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Her professional design work has received recognition at local and international forums.

She has authored and presented papers at local and international conferences on Urban Design, Environment, Gender, and Education. Ar. With a 23-year association with AKCS-P, his primary focus has been on the planning, conservation, and management of heritage buildings in Pakistan. He has had the privilege of contributing to several prominent projects of which most are UNESCO Awards winners, including the conservation of the 400-year-old Shigar Fort, Khaplu Palace, the 900-year-old Altit Fort, the 17th c. Mughal-era Shahi Hammam, and the Wazir Khan Mosque in Lahore.

Currently, he is leading the conservation efforts at the World Heritage Site of Lahore Fort, which involves the restoration of the world's largest mural Picture Wall, as well as the preservation of Sheesh Mahal, Summer Palace, two temples, mosque, various basements and the establishment of a Visitors and Interpretation Center as central components. In addition to his role at AKCS-P, he is also associated with WHITRAP China, ICOMOS Pakistan, the Pakistan Council of Architects & Town Planners, and the Institute of Architects Pakistan. He has presented papers/presentations related to heritage conservation in both national and international conferences.

He is also a graduate of the 88th National Management Course offered by National School of Public Policy, Lahore, Pakistan.

Noman has taught in the leading Architecture and Planning institutions in Karachi and also supervised postgraduate research in the same disciplines. Noman worked as a Faculty Member and Coordinator of, the Urban Design Graduate Program at the Dawood College of Engineering and Technology, Karachi from 1989 to 2000. Thereafter he set up an Architecture and Planning Department at the NED University of Engineering and Technology, Karachi in 2000. He is currently working as a Professor and Dean at, the Faculty of Architecture and Management Sciences at NED University.

In 2020, he was awarded Tamgha-e-Imtiaz, conferred on 23 March 2021 on the occasion of Pakistan Day. He is also the chairholder and Network Coordinator of the UNESCO Chair on Sustainable Urban Regions at the NED University, Karachi.
